

ONE OF AMERICA'S BEST COMMUNITIES!

Back in March of 2015, Tualatin submitted an application to the Frontier Communications' America's Best Communities competition with a community revitalization plan to bridge the gap between the need for a highly technically skilled workforce and a need to develop the workforce for the future here in Tualatin. In January 2016, Tualatin's plan was one of just 15 communities to be selected as a semi-finalist!

Focusing on the need to have a creative community space to adjoin the use of technology, education, and appreciating the arts and cultural experiences, the proposed community plan seeks to build a Mobile Makerspace. This community space, along with associated programming, would bring together the elements of STEAM (Science, Technology, Education, Arts, Math) with building a pipeline of skilled workers for Tualatin's employers in the future. This space will be a place to educate people of all ages, a venue for the performing arts, and also support the needs of local businesses to provide training and continuing education. By cultivating students in the STEAM principles, teaching them about STEAM jobs AND creativity and ingenuity, in a connected community space, the plan will help to build a strong community and robust economy.

This community revitalization plan is led by our Tualatin ABC team, comprised of community partners including the Mask & Mirror Community Theatre, the Tualatin Chamber of Commerce and is supported by Tualatin Tomorrow Advisory Committee, Oregon Tech, and the South Metro Salem steam partnership. To date, the group has raised over \$75,000 from national and community sponsors to complete the planning process and demonstrate local support.

... What's next for our plan? ...

This month, the Tualatin ABC team travels to North Carolina to present our plan as one of 15 semi-finalist communities. From this group, 8 finalists will be selected to receive \$100,000 to start implementing their plans and compete for the top 3 prizes of \$1, \$2 and \$3 million dollars!

CURIOUS ABOUT LEAD IN YOUR DRINKING WATER?

With water quality being in the news lately, we want to assure the residents of Tualatin that our water consistently meets or surpasses all federal and state drinking water standards. Lead is rarely found above even detectable levels in our source water! Unlike Flint, Michigan, and in other areas across the country, lead service lines were never used in our distribution system.

In our area, the most common source for lead found in our water is from household plumbing. This is usually lead solder that was used in homes built or plumbed with copper pipes between 1970 and 1985. Lead can also be found in brass plumbing fixtures and components installed prior to 2014, with components older than 1985 having potentially higher amounts of lead. Even for these high-risk homes, we've seen a 70% reduction of lead in water thanks to the treatment of drinking water to make it less corrosive.

If you are concerned about lead levels in your drinking water, contact the LeadLine at LEADLINE.ORG or 503.988.4000 to request a free lead-in-water test kit.

*Here are some other simple steps
you can take to reduce your exposure
to lead in drinking water:*

- Run your water to flush out lead. If water hasn't been used for several hours, run the water for 30 seconds to 2 minutes or until it reaches a steady temperature before drinking or cooking.
- Use cold, rather than hot, fresh water for cooking and preparing baby formula. Lead dissolves more easily into hot water.
- Do not boil water to remove lead. Boiling water will not reduce lead.
- Consider using a filter. Confirm the filter is approved to reduce lead. Always maintain and replace a filter device in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions to protect water quality. Contact NSF International at (800) NSF-8010 or NSF.ORG for information on performance standards for water filters.
- Test your child for lead. Ask your physician, or call the LeadLine at 503.988.4000 to find out how to have your child tested for lead.
- Consider buying low-lead fixtures. As of January 1, 2014, all pipes, fittings, and fixtures are required to contain less than 0.25% lead. When buying new fixtures, consumers should seek out those with the lowest lead content. Visit NSF.ORG to learn more about lead content in plumbing fixtures.
- Regularly clean your faucet aerator. Particles containing lead from solder or household plumbing can become trapped in your faucet aerator.



TUALATIN CITIZEN ACADEMY

The Tualatin Police Department will hold its annual citizen's academy, The Tualatin Police Experience, April 21-23.

Members of our city have the opportunity to take a tour of our facility, learn the functions of the police department and its members, take part in defensive tactics exercises, learn emergency vehicle driving, and safely shoot police firearms. It's a great way of sharing a small percentage of what it's like to be an officer and what our department does every day to stay safe and protect others. SW CORRIDOR UPDATE PROJECT UPDATE

The Southwest Corridor Project is focused on studying high capacity transit (HCT) from Southwest Portland to Tigard and Tualatin in order to better serve our growing communities. In January, the Steering Committee voted to remove two of the five Tigard alignment options which were being considered. Further, the Downtown Tualatin terminus option was removed due to limited funding available. The new preferred terminus alternative for further study will be at Bridgeport Village.

The Steering Committee has been considering mode options, light rail (LRT) or bus rapid transit (BRT), as well as alternatives to serve Portland Community College Sylvania Campus. The Steering Committee is scheduled to make a decision regarding mode and PCC alternatives on May 9.

PLANNING STAFF ARE HERE TO HELP

The Planning Division has a new Scoping and Pre-Application meeting process for land use applications! The purpose of the Scoping and Pre-Application meetings is to offer early assistance in the land use and permitting process. This includes thoughtful feedback on preliminary design direction and visioning, outlining expectations, and to assist the applicant in attaining a complete application at first submittal.

The new process is intended to clarify the needed application requirements and available meeting dates. The required materials will assist the planning staff in preparing project specific comments and guidance for applicants. The Scoping and Pre-Application meetings are held weekly between the hours of Monday 3-4 pm. or Wednesday 2-4 pm.
